Braulio E. Dujali adds another feather on its cap; bags national award

PICC Manila- *"I am very glad that once again our collective efforts are given recognitions. The program thrusts of the Local Government Unit (LGU) for the past years geared towards **Sustainable Development** with focus in **Organic Agriculture** to achieve **Food Security and Sufficiency**"* said the Lady Mayor Lolita A. Moral upon receiving the award from the Department of Agriculture (DA) during the awarding ceremony of the 10th Organic Agriculture Congress held at the Philippine International Convention Center (PICC) on October 17, 2013.



Braulio E. Dujali is adjudged as Top Performing LGU in a reward system for stakeholders practicing *Organic Agriculture* involved in the implementation of **National Organic Agriculture Program (NOAP)**.

In its quest for recognition, Braulio E. Dujali featured best practices in organic agriculture such as BED Rice Program with black and brown rice as main products; produced in a chemical free and an environment friendly methods. Under this program, the LGU implemented the **PalayCheck System** with 8 KeyChecks as protocol for rice farming, **Expanded Modified Rapid Composting (EMRC)**, **Village Type Tricogramma Laboratory** that produce *tricogramma japonicum* a biological control of rice stem borer and Vermi Culture and Vermi- Cast production which is one of the main components of organic agriculture.

It has a Palayamanan Project showcasing organic integrated farming system for rice, swine, goat, sheep, cattle, poultry and ducks, and almost 50 beds for vermi- culture and vermi- cast production with a conducive Farmers' Training Center for Organic Agriculture that can accommodate 50 farmers.



According to Municipal Agriculturist Nelson C. Baer *“Organic farming not only helps preserve the soil fertility, but aid local rice farmers and other food producers as well, not to suffer high cost of farm inputs such as fertilizers and chemicals. Organic farming use organic materials such as farmyard manure and green manure crops which can be acquired locally at cheaper costs.”*

“Organic Agriculture includes all agricultural systems that promote the ecologically sound, socially acceptable, economically viable and technically feasible production of food and fibers. Organic agriculture dramatically reduces external inputs by refraining from the use of chemical fertilizers, pesticides and pharmaceuticals (RA 10068 Section 3 B)”.

It could be remembered that long before the approval and implementation of RA 10068, otherwise known as Organic Agriculture Act of 2010 together with its Implementing Rules and Regulation (IRR), the Municipality of Braulio E. Dujali has been practicing Organic Agriculture. In fact during the incumbency of then Vice Mayor Lolita A. Moral in 2001 that landmark legislation in organic agriculture was approved, this is Municipal Ordinance Number 44 s. 2001 otherwise known as “An Ordinance Prohibiting the Burning of Rice Hays or any Part Thereof within the Territorial Jurisdiction of Braulio E. Dujali.”

Through the years, the LGU has strengthened the service delivery mechanisms in the agricultural sector to improve the quality of life of our farmer- constituents. As a result the municipality was able to produce **three (3) Gawad Saka National Winners and eight (8) Regional Winners, two (2) Irrigators’ Association National Hall of Fame Awardees (DITCIA 1 and BASIA). In 2011, the municipality made it good in the Agri- Pinoy Rice Achievers Awards (APRAA) by winning**

three (3) categories namely, Local Government Unit (LGU), Agricultural Extension Workers (AEWs) and Irrigators' Association (IA) in the national level.



To sustain its efforts in promoting organic agriculture the **1 Million Peso** cash incentive for winning the APRAA is given to Braulio E. Dujali Officials and Employees, Multi- Purpose Cooperative (BEDMOE, MPC) as an initial Working Capital for Organically Grown Rice Trading. To encourage organic farmers their produce be bought at P1 higher than the prevailing price. Now that another 1 million Peso cash incentive courtesy of DA Organic Agriculture Program will be utilized as additional working capital to give more incentive to the farmers.

Ms. Lorna A. Escobar also bags the Top Performing Agricultural Extension Workers' (AEWs) category on the same event.

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE MEMBERS OF BRAULIO E. DUJALI PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE STATION FOR EXEMPLARY PERFORMANCE IN SUCCESFULLY ARRESTING ONE JUSPER LOVE M. TABUADA AND CONFISCATING ONE (1) BUNDLE OF MARIJUANA FRUITING TOPS WEIGHING 480 GRAMS FROM THE LATTER'S POSSESSION ON OCTOBER 10, 2013.

WHEREAS, the Philippine National Police (PNP) is an essential tool in undertaking the prime duty of Government to serve and protect the people, to maintain peace and order, to protect life, liberty and property and to promote the general welfare according to the mandates of the Constitution;

WHEREAS, the Braulio E. Dujali PNP team under the command of Police Senior Inspector ARWYN D. GAFFUD fulfilled their mission to enforce the law, to prevent and control crimes, when they arrested an illegal-drug transporter last October 10, 2013 at Tanglaw, Braulio E. Dujali, Davao del Norte;

WHEREAS, after receiving intelligence report on the transportation of illegal drugs by suspects called as "biyahedor" in Barangay Tanglaw, Braulio E. Dujali, Davao del Norte, the members Braulio E. Dujali Police Station led by Police Senior Inspector ARWYN D. GAFFUD immediately conducted surveillance, and on October 10, 2013, the operation yielded positive result where one suspect identified as Jusper Love M. Tabuada was arrested and confiscated from his possession one (1) bundle of Marijuana Fruiting Tops weighing 480 grams, the first ever voluminous accomplishment on anti-illegal drugs campaign of this Municipality;



WHEREAS, the members Braulio E. Dujali Police Station has made another remarkable accomplishment, if not for their acts of valor, tactical abilities, and hardwork, the pemidious effects of the said illegal drugs would have ravaged our youth who are vulnerable to such vice;

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2013 - 173

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A BIRTHING FACILITY (PAANAKAN) IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BRAULIO E. DUJALI, DAVAO DEL NORTE AND PRESCRIBING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS THEREOF.

BE IT ENACTED by the Sangguniang Bayan that:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Ordinance shall be called as the **BRAULIO E. DUJALI BIRTHING FACILITY (PAANAKAN) ORDINANCE.**

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is the policy of this Municipality to provide and deliver the basic health needs of its constituents through the implementation of programs and projects on maternal and child care as mandated under item (2) (iii) Section 17 of RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991. Hence, it is the main thrust and commitment of this Municipality to strengthen its advocacy for facility-based deliveries attended by professional birth attendants and discourage homebirths, by providing a Birthing Facility (*paanakan*) so that the "low-risk" pregnant women shall enjoy safe delivery in a gender and culturally sensitive Birthing Facility (*paanakan*) at an affordable rate, with an holistic approach and provide quality prenatal & Newborn Care through:

- 1) Capability building of the health staff;
- 2) Networking & Collaboration with stakeholders;
- 3) Promotions of Public Health & Wellness Programs;
- 4) Regular Monitoring & Evaluation.

SECTION 3. SCOPE AND APPLICATION. This ordinance shall apply to the entire process of the operation and imposition of fees of the Birthing Facility and increase the proficiency delivery by 10% every year.

A. Services Offered:

- 1) Delivery Care
- 2) Newborn Care
- 3) Newborn Screening
- 4) Health Education
- 5) Referrals & Networking

B. Criteria of admission:

- 1) Gravida 2-4

- 2) Age 19-35
- 3) No past or present obstetrical & Medical Problems
- 4) Age of Gestation – More than 37 weeks
- 5) Singleton Pregnancy Cephalic presentation
- 6) Prenatal check-up

SECTION 4. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this ordinance the following terms shall mean as:

- a) **Birthing Facility (Paanakan)** – A maternal and child healthcare service facility;
- b) **Gender and Culture Sensitive** – Recognizing the gender and cultural differences, inequalities and specific needs of women and men and acting on this awareness;
- c) **Homebirth**- Practice of traditional home deliveries or delivery attended by the traditional birth attendant (*hilot or mananabang*);
- d) **Holistic** – Treating the person in his/her totality;
- e) **Prenatal** – The period of conception, before giving birth;
- f) **Newborn** – The period referring to the first 28 days of life;
- g) **Pregnant** – A female who is carrying a baby within her body;
- h) **Obstetrical Problems** - Any problem related to the pregnancy;
- i) **Gestation** – The duration of pregnancy;
- j) **Singleton** – A pregnancy with only one fetus inside;
- k) **Cephalic** – A type of pregnancy where the head is the presenting part;
- l) **Collaboration** – To work together;
- m) **Gravida** – The number of the pregnancy of woman delivered has. (?);
- n) **Parity** – The number of children a woman delivered;
- o) **Newborn Screening** – A test done on a newborn aged 24-72 hours to detect the following Disorders:
 1. Congenital hypothyroidism
 2. Congenital adrenal hyperplasia
 3. Glucose – 6 – phosphate dehydrogenase (G6PD) Disorder
 4. Galactocemia
 5. Phenylketonuria
- p) **Post-partum** – A period from the time of delivery to 42 days after giving birth;
- q) **MCP**- Maternal and Child Health Care Package
- r) **MCH** - Maternal and Child Health Care
- s) **PhilHealth Refund** - A refund from PhilHealth to this Municipality for the delivery and medical services provided to every patient assisted and served with PhilHealth Membership Card in accordance with the standard rates allowed by the PHIC;
- t) **Resident** – At least 6 months residency and has at least 4 prenatal visits;
- u) **Community Health Volunteer** - A person who freely offers to help and assist the mother in her needs during ante-natal period, labor and post-partum period in the Birthing Facility, also known as BHWs (barangay health workers) and TBAs (traditional birth attendants);
- v) **BEMONC-trained** - Basic Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care trained.

SECTION 5. REGULATORY FEES.

- a) For resident PHIC Members – Free with medicine
 - All PhilHealth documents shall have to be duly complied and signed by the PhilHealth Member/Patient and be submitted to the PhilHealth In-charge in the Municipal Health Office;
- b) For resident non-PHIC Members – Php 3,000.00 with free medicine;

- c) For resident Indigents as identified/certified by the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer and Non-PHIC member – PhP 1,500.00 with free medicine;
- d) For Non-Residents of Braulio E. Dujali
 - d.1. Philhealth Member -PhP 1,500.00 with free medicine
 - d.2. Non-Philhealth Member -PhP 3,500.00 with free medicine
- e) New Born Screening for babies delivered through MCP is free, while babies delivered outside the Paanakan –PhP 600.00

SECTION 6. BILLING. All Non-PHIC patients admitted shall be properly billed at the Birthing Facility. All charges shall be reflected in the patient's billing and be paid directly at the office of the Municipal Treasurer to collect such charges.

SECTION 7. BIRTHING FACILITY SERVICES. The Birthing Facility shall be opened twenty four (24) hours daily. Birthing services shall be extended to admitted pregnant women due for birth deliveries twenty four (24) hours a day until advised for proper discharging.



SECTION 8. ADMISSION. The Birthing Facility shall give priority attendance to bona fide residents of the Municipality of Braulio E. Dujali, Davao del Norte;

SECTION 9. RECORD KEEPING AND OPERATION BUDGET. The Municipal Health Officer, the Municipal Treasurer and the Municipal Accountant shall account the funds using the usual accounting rules and procedures. A sharing scheme between the LGU of Braulio E. Dujali, Davao del Norte (General Fund) and the Birthing Facility (Special Trust Fund) shall be implemented. Fifty (50) percent of the revenues, sale of medicines and commodities and user fees derived from the operations of the Birthing Facility (*paanakan*), as well as donations obtained from public and private individuals, organization and corporations, both foreign and domestic, shall be placed in the Special Trust Fund, and it shall augment the financial requirements needed for the operations and maintenance of the said birthing facility. The remaining Fifty (50) percent of the proceeds shall accrue to the General Fund;

9.a. The Special Trust Fund is a special account in the Local Treasury that has its own and distinct book of accounts and/or ledger to facilitate the effective and efficient collection, placement and disbursement of revenues, daims, donations and similar financial resources based on generally accepted accounting and auditing policies and practices of local governments and that of the Commission on Audit for the exclusive benefit of the Birthing Facility's operations and maintenance. The said fund shall be deposited in a reputable and accredited government depository bank under a special trust account whose authorized signatories are the Municipal Treasurer, Municipal Accountant and Municipal Health Officer. Said signatories shall be authorized to deposit to withdraw from and/or invest the said fund;

9.b. The annual budget of *THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P300,000.00)* for the operations and maintenance of the Birthing Facility shall come from the local health fund that will be appropriated for the Birthing Facility and appropriations provided for the Annual Budget of the Local Government subject to the approval of the Local Legislative Council.

SECTION 10. CREATION OF THE MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH CARE (MCH) FUND. For the sustainability of the MCH program, the LGU can provide finances through the utilization of MCP (PHIC reimbursements), government grants, and local health fund. The claims from PhilHealth's maternal and child healthcare package and all applicable packages shall also be placed in the said MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH CARE (MCH) FUND. The utilization of the MCP reimbursements to the MCP-accredited birthing facility should be as follows:

a.1) Supplies / Medicines / Equipment /	
Building Improvement -----	40%
a.2) Incentives for staff officially designated as such	
and BHW / TBA -----	60%
1. Physician/s -----	35%
2. Nurse (BEMONC-trained) -----	20 %
3. Attending Midwife -----	20 %
4. BHS Midwife -----	10%
5. Dentist -----	6%
6. BHW / TBA -----	4%
7. Med Tech -----	5%

The allocation mentioned above shall be given to the different personnel who have rendered specific functions and services to the MCP dients. The profit sharing will be released quarterly and will follow the guidelines. The funds allocation for Philhealth MCP will be deposited in a bank as trust fund and will be disbursed subject to PHIC-MCP guidelines and auditing/accounting rules and regulations.

SECTION 11. THE MUNICIPAL HEALTH OFFICE (MHO). The Birthing Facility shall be operated and managed by the Municipality through the Municipal Health Office.

The MHO shall formulate guidelines circulars, and memorandums about rules and regulations regarding the operation of the Birthing Facility Center, supervise health personnel and support services and to guarantee that women can avail of the safe motherhood program. In the operation of the facility, the municipal health officer shall ensure that all policies, guidelines and standards set by the Department of Health (DOH) are strictly followed and complied with.

SECTION 12. PERSONNEL AND STAFF. The MHO shall be assisted by nurses, midwives and utility personnel for the sustainability of the operation of the Birthing Facility, specifically the following:

- a. Nurse - 3
- b. Registered Midwife - 6
- c. Utility Aide - 2
- d. Laundry in charge - 1
- e. Driver - 2

The assignment of personnel-in-charge in the Birthing Facility shall be in rotational scheme to assure that it operates twenty four (24) hours. It shall be ensured that every eight (8) hours, there shall be one (1) nurse, two (2) midwives, one (1) utility aide and one (1) driver on duty.



SECTION 13. USE OF AMBULANCE VEHICLE. The Birthing Facility shall be provided with an ambulance to respond emergency cases at all times. The use of ambulance vehicle shall be for patients on emergency that need to be ushered to the Birthing Facility of this Municipality and for patients to be referred to secondary or tertiary hospitals for immediate medical assistance and treatment.

SECTION 14. AFFILIATION. The Birthing Facility may accept affiliation of nursing/midwifery students from reputable schools and colleges, subject to the following requirements:

- a.) Approval of Sangguniang Bayan;
- b.) Execution of Memorandum of Agreement for affiliation;
- c.) Payment by the school or college of affiliation fee of ₱30/day per shift midwifery student and ₱50 per nursing student;
- d.) Students shall go on duty at the Birthing Facility. All policies and guidelines of the Birthing Facility shall be strictly followed during the affiliation period.

SECTION 15. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any section or provision of this ordinance, or any portion thereof, or the application of such section, provision or portion thereof to any person, group or circumstance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall not be effected by such declaration and shall remain in force and effect.

SECTION 16. REPEALING CLAUSE. The provisions of other ordinances, executive orders, rules and regulations inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 17. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval.
